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Where is God's Kingdom?

The institutional churches basically teach that when you die, if you have been good enough, that you will go to Heaven which they say is God's Kingdom and where we want to wind up. But this teaching is not to be found in the Scriptures and is a made up fable.

In the Bible the definition of God's Kingdom can overlap between a few words or meanings, but primarily it is one general understanding that God wants us to know about. We see the same “overlapping” with other words or names we are familiar with. Take the word “*blue*”. Ask several people what it means and they will most often say it is a color. But “*blue*” can mean “sad” too, however not most of the time.

The same is true of the term “God's Kingdom” in the Bible. The vast majority of the time (upwards of 90%) it refers to God's government that will finally be enforced over the evil kingdoms of men, and it will be centered from a specific “Kingdom Nation” right here on Earth, which rule other redeemed nations of the Earth will follow.

God's Kingdom can at times be closely connected to *God's will* everywhere and over every situation since He has all authority over all things. Such as when someone would receive a healing it may be said that “God's Kingdom (His will) has come upon him”. There are a few times (like we see with the word “blue”) that we read of this *variation* in the Bible. Still the inference in the original Bible language simply meant “this healing is what it will be like in the fullness of God's government rule in the Earth”, as an example of life in the coming Kingdom.

Therefore nearly always, and as related to God's plan for the ages, “God's Kingdom” in the Bible strictly refers to God's government, for this is directly laid out in the Scriptural definition of Jesus Christ's literal physical and spiritual rule over the Earth at His second coming as predicted by the prophet Isaiah when the Earth is filled with peace:

“For unto us a child is born (Christ), unto us a son is given: and the government shall be upon His shoulder --- of the increase of His government and peace there shall be no end – and upon His Kingdom, to order it with judgment and justice --” (Isaiah 9:6,7)

Jesus Christ told the corrupt rulers of Judea where King David once ruled over the national Kingdom of God “*The Kingdom of God shall be taken from you and given to a nation bringing forth the fruits thereof” Christ was speaking of good national ruler-ship and not a mere “spiritual kingdom” or one that is “in a person's heart”.*

Finally when we read about “*the Kingdom of Heaven*” in the Bible it should be made clear that the Kingdom of Heaven is not Heaven itself (God's spiritual domain). In the Book of Daniel the 7th chapter tells us that the Earthly rule of God's Kingdom will take place “under the whole Heaven” (7:27) and not in Heaven. “*The Kingdom of Heaven*” simply means that God's Kingdom government in the Earth receives its laws from our Father in Heaven.
